



Internationally recognized as an accomplished researcher and transformative higher education leader, **Satish K. Tripathi** is the 15<sup>th</sup> president of the University at Buffalo and the first international-born president in UB's history.

Born and raised in India, President Tripathi came to the United States in 1978 to join the Department of Computer Science faculty at the University of Maryland. In addition to earning three master's degrees, he received his doctorate in computer science from the University of Toronto.

President Tripathi holds many awards, including two from India: an honorary doctorate of sciences from the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Allahabad; and the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi, where he earned a master's degree.

Under President Tripathi's leadership, UB is recognized as one of the most actively engaged U.S. research universities operating in India. In 2005, President Tripathi signed a memorandum of understanding with Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to establish the Indo-U.S. Inter-University Collaborative Initiative in Higher Education and Research, which has led to a significant partnership between UB and Amrita University.

The president's vision for UB's future focuses on moving the university into the highest ranks of the nation's leading research universities, through expanding its reach and impact locally as well as globally.

# **PROGRAM ITINERARY**

# January 31, 2020 – Depart U.S.A.

\*Departure dates from the U.S. will vary depending on choice of airline and departure city.

## February 1 – Arrive New Delhi

Met on arrival and transferred to your hotel. Overnight: Le Meridien (no meals) \*Early arrival is possible. Please contact the tour operator for rates and hotel bookings.

# February 2 – Historic City Tour of Delhi

The historic tour begins at Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India. Drive past the magnificent Red Fort, a marvel in red sandstone, built on the banks of River Yamuna by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan.

The 12th century Qutab Minar is a gracefully hand-carved for its entire height of 234 ft- a engineering marvel back in the day. Visit the mausoleum of emperor Humayun which was a forerunner of the Mughal style of architecture. The tour will also stop at India Gate, the President's Residence, Parliament House and the Secretariat buildings - an interesting blend of the Victorian and 20th century architecture.

Welcome dinner with limited bar. Overnight: Le Meridien (B, Welcome Dinner)

# February 3 – Delhi | Jaipur


Depart for Jaipur popularly known as "Pink City". India's first planned city, Jaipur was built on the classical architectural principals of *Vaastu Shastra* and divided into a grid thereby segregating the residential from the commercial areas. *Overnight: ITC Rajputana* (B, L)

# February 4 – Historic Jaipur Tour

Guided visits to Jaipur's famous forts and historic places.

Visit the Amber Fort which is a classic, romantic Rajasthani Fort Palace, with its rugged, time-ravaged walls and fascinating palaces inside.

The City Palace is the former residence of the royal family and now a museum. Built in the style of a fortified campus, the palace covers almost one-seventh in area of the old city. One of the major attractions in the museum is the Armory Museum, housing an impressive array of weaponry. Stop at Jantar Mantar, one of the largest stone and marble crafted observatory in the world. The observatory has seventeen large instruments, many of them in working condition. *Overnight: ITC Rajputana (B, L)* 



# Februaury 5 – Jaipur | Agra

Depart for Agra with a stop at Fatehpur Sikri. Fatehpur Sikri was a former capital of the Mughal empire, but due to inadequate potable water, it was abandoned a few years after it was founded. Arrive in Agra and check in. Time permitting, we will visit the Taj Mahal at sunset.

Overnight: ITC Mughal (B, L)

# February 6 – Historic Tour of Agra

Early morning sunrise visit to the famous Taj Mahal. This monument is an amazing feat of human industry and a perfect example of beauty, symmetry and aesthetics. Only when one enters the main gates and gaze upon the Taj, does the enormity of the task of building this mammoth structure hit the visitor. Built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jehan, this was a tribute of love for his favorite wife Mumtaz Mahal.

Visit the Agra Fort. This fort was started by Emperor Akbar in 1565. The palace is a notable for its smooth blending of Hindu and central Asian architectural styles. *Overnight: ITC Mughal (B, L)* 

# February 7 – Agra-Jhansi (by train) | Khajuraho (by road)

Check out and depart by train to Jhansi Station. Met upon arrival and continue to Khajuraho by road. Khajuraho is famous for its 12<sup>th</sup> century temples many having erotic sculptures from the Kama Sutra. These temples are designed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Overnight: Ramada (B, L)

#### February 8 – Historic Khajuraho Temples

Visit to the western and eastern group of temples. These monuments to religion were built during the rule of the Chandela dynasty between 950 and 1050 A.D. The most significant of them is the Kandariya Mahadev Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva- one of the largest and most typical of the Khajuraho temples. *Overnight: Ramada* (B, L)

## February 9 - Khajuraho | Varanasi

Fly to Varanasi, India's holiest city located on the banks of the Ganges. Varanasi, also known as Kashi or Benares, is one of the oldest living cities of the world with its history dating back to about 3,500 hundred years.

This evening, witness an Aarti (prayer) ceremony. You are taken on a boat on the river from where you can watch devotees come to the Ghats (steps) to offer prayers and float tiny oil lamps on the river. *Overnight*: *Taj Gateway* (B)







# February 10 – Historic Tour of Varanasi

Early morning boat ride at holy river Ganges which has a quieter, more serene feel. Later in the morning enjoy a half day city tour of Varanasi which includes a visit to some important temples like the Bharat Mata Mandir and the Durga Temple.

Afternoon visit to the Sarnath. It is said that after attaining enlightenment, the Buddha came to Sarnath, where he gave his first sermon. The museum next to this site contains some of the richest antiques from the Ashoka period.

Make a stop at Benares Hindu University, President Tripathi's alma mater.

Farewell dinner with limited bar (local wine, beer, soft drinks). Overnight: Taj Gateway (B, Farewell Dinner)

# February 11 – Varanasi | Mumbai (Tour of Mumbai)

Flight to Mumbai. On arrival, take a tour of the city. Drive along Marine Drive, the sea front boulevard, also known as the "Queen's Necklace" thanks to the twinkling lights at dusk along the curved roadway. While driving through this cosmopolitan city one views a wide spectrum of architecture including the magnificent Victoria Terminus a remarkable example of Victorian Gothic architecture in India. The city is also filled with a diverse selection of British designed buildings including the Municipal buildings originally built in the 1800's.

Arrive at your hotel in the late afternoon and check in. Overnight: ITC Grand Central (B)

# February 12 – Depart

Depart for your onward journey back home or continue your adventure in India (see optional extensions below.)

Participants who are not able to walk unassisted for extended periods are kindly advised not to join this tour unless accompanied by an able-bodied companion who will be able to assist you at all times. # February 12-17

Immerse yourself in Tamil Nadu, South India's most vibrant state. Visit the ancient temples of Mahabalipuram – the 7<sup>th</sup> century port city and wander the former French colony of Pondicherry. This unique city has flavors of French architecture, language and even cuisine.

**Feb. 15** – Puducherry. The Promenade (B)

**Feb. 16** – Tour of Puducherry and Auroville. *The Promenade* (B)

**Feb. 17** - Return to Chennai and connect to onward flight home.

# PARTICIPANT'S AGREEMENT

Your signature on our tour reservation form will signify your agreement with the following terms and conditions.

Introduction: These are the terms and conditions applicable to the tour packages provided by Immersion Journeys LLC, University at Buffalo, Engaging Journeys, Inc (collectively "Immersion Journeys", University at Buffalo, Engaging Journeys, Inc., "we", "us" and "our"). The terms "client" "you" and "your" refer to each person who purchases and/or uses a tour package provided by Immersion Journeys.

**Benefits of Tour Packages:** Our tour packages offer services of a professional tour guide, accommodations, meals as outlined in the itinerary, transportation as specified in the itinerary and excursions and tours as outlined in the itinerary.

Immersion Journeys may, from time to time, offer you optional services or benefits. By using those services and/or benefits when they become available, you agree to be bound by any supplemental terms applicable to those services or benefits We will send final documents

and tickets by overnight or registered mail approximately two (2) weeks prior to the start of the tour.

Rates and Exclusions: The rates and charges for tour participation are those established at the time the tour is booked with Immersion Journeys. We reserve the right to increase tour prices to cover increased costs, tariffs, taxes and V.A.T. received after prices are published and to reflect fluctuations in foreign exchange markets. Published rates and charges are typically "per person," based upon double occupancy with en suite bath (unless otherwise stated). Single rooms are subject to a single room supplemental charges which are stated in the proposal. Expenses and terms not specifically identified in the applicable Immersion Journeys produced quotation are not covered. These include any paperwork or charges associated with: passports, visas, immunization, meals other than those specified, optional excursions, trip protection coverage, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine and liquor), all beverages excluding those provided in Immersion Journeys vehicles, telephone calls, room service, laundry, personal items, baggage handling, international airfare unless otherwise stated, gratuities and transportation to or from any departure gateway and any other costs that might be incurred not stated in tour package. Some governments charge departure taxes and/or fees. These fees are the responsibility of each passenger travelling to the designated country and are not included unless stated.

**Payment.** We accept the following forms of payment: major credit cards, bank transfer or checks drawn on a U.S. Bank. Credit cards will incur a service fee of 3–5% paid by the client. You must promptly pay the following fees and charges for participation in an Immersion Journeys tour.

**Airfare:** Full payment per person is due in order to purchase airline tickets. Airline cancellation policy shall apply. Discounted airfare quote (if available) is subject to purchase of ground package.

**Ground Package:** A deposit of \$1,000 per person per tour is required immediately to secure the tour and services. This amount may vary depending on the destination, accommodations and services.

**Balance:** The balance of the tour price is due 60 days before departure.

**Revisions:** A fee of \$125 per booking for each change made sixty (60) days or more prior to the start of the tour. The cancellation fees set forth below apply to changes made less than sixty (60) days prior to the start of the tour.

Cancellation by You: We must receive your cancellation notice in writing by email, fax, or overnight courier, and your cancellation date will be the date on which we receive your notice. Simultaneously with your notice, you must pay the following cancellation charge based upon the amount of notice provided. In addition, airline cancellation policies shall apply for cancelled tours involving air transportation:

There is no refund for unused portions of a tour once it has commenced, and you are solely responsible for costs incurred by you due to missed, canceled or delayed transportation. Your decision not to participate on the tour due to State Department warnings, fear of travel, illness or any other reason will be deemed a cancellation. If a flight or other delay for any reason prevents you from joining the tour on the tour departure date and time, you will be considered a no-show, and we cannot provide a full or partial refund or credit toward a future tour, but you may join the tour late if you wish and must pay an additional operational expense if applicable such as, but not limited to special transport arrangements, hotel accommodations and local staff to assist.

Insurance: Immersion Journeys recommends that you purchase trip cancellation, medical, and baggage insurance to cover penalties and cancellation charges. University at Buffalo will send an insurance application upon receipt of reservation and deposit although you may select any insurer of your choice. However, any questions about what travel insurance does or does not cover should be addressed directly to the travel insurance company. If you decline insurance coverage, you will personally assume full responsibility for any financial loss associated with your travel arrangements, and you could lose your travel investment and/or have to pay more money to correct the situation.

We may in our sole discretion substitute services such as hotels or goods of similar quality for any service or good stated in the itinerary. If a tour is cancelled, our liability is limited to a full refund of your payments, and we will not be liable for any other costs, damages, or refunds of any kind for any loss, delay, inconvenience, disappointment, or expense whatsoever in such circumstances.
